

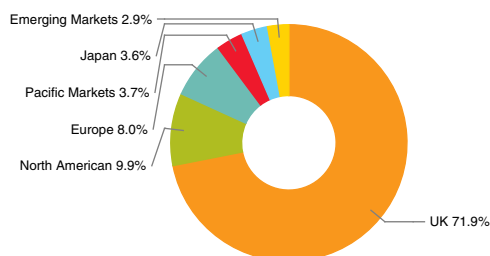
Prudential Global Equity fund (Series 1)



Fund description

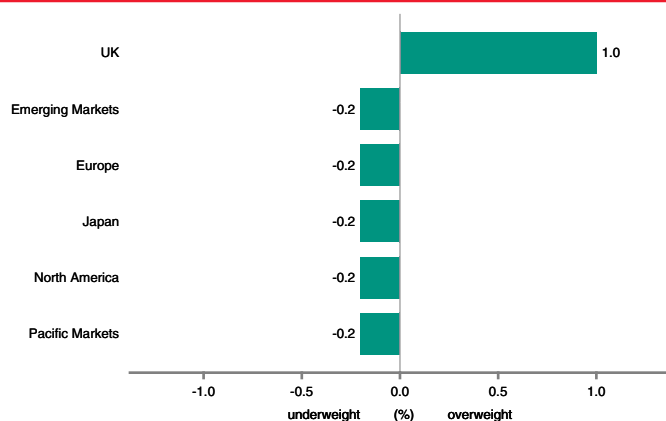
The investment strategy of the fund is to purchase units in the M&G PP Global Equity Fund. This fund invests in the shares of UK and overseas companies. The fund is actively managed with a benchmark of 70% in UK equities and 30% in overseas equities (in the same proportions as the average overseas equity distribution in the BNY Mellon CAPS Balanced Pooled Fund Survey). The significant numbers of stocks held in each region reflect the prudent approach adopted by this fund. Both active stock selection and asset allocation are used to add value.

Commentary

Equities suffered sharp falls during the third quarter of 2011 as investors became increasingly concerned that Greece might default on its government debt and that the global economy could slip back into recession. Against this uncertain background, the fund declined in absolute terms but was ahead of the comparative median and in line with its composite benchmark.

Having a long position in UK equities, helped the performance of the fund. In addition, successful stock selection in the UK Equity Dividend fund and the UK Smaller Companies fund added value.

Stock selection within the fund's equity holdings in Europe, Japan and the emerging markets were also beneficial, although the choice of stocks in North America and the Pacific region hampered performance.

Amid concerns that global consumer demand could remain under pressure and with the European debt crisis continuing to cast a dark shadow, the fund manager maintained his preference for UK equities. In his opinion, UK equities should offer a better balance of opportunity and security for investors than their peers in Europe, North America and the Pacific over the next few months.

Reflecting this strategy, the fund manager kept the fund's overweight in UK equities and slightly increased the underweight positions in equities from North America, Japan, Europe and the emerging markets.

Who manages the funds?

This fund is managed by M&G Investments.

How are the performance figures calculated?

The performance shown overleaf is measured on the fluctuation of the daily published price. This published price is adjusted to accommodate the fund's dealing cycle where appropriate.

How are the fund prices calculated?

This fund has both an offer and a bid price, based on the valuation of the underlying assets of the fund and which typically differs by 5%. Your contributions are used to buy units at the offer price. Your benefits are realised by selling units at the bid price.

What is the dealing cycle?

This fund is historic priced which means that the unit price is set before money is invested.

This fund has a dealing cycle of T-1. This means that the money received on day T buys units at the valuation date price applicable 1 day earlier.

Other important information

Exchange Rate fluctuations may cause the Sterling values of overseas investments to rise or fall.

Please note the performance figures shown take into account the effect of the Annual Management Charge (AMC).
